Job Hotspot - Hairdresser



In this bulletin we are looking at working in the hairdressing industry.

Entry requirements differ but you'll usually need:

- 2 or more GCSE's at grades 9 to 2 or equivalent, for a level 2 course.
- 4 or 5 GCSE's at grades 9 to 4, or equivalent, for a level 3 course.
- 4 or 5 GCSE's at grades 9 to 4, or equivalent, including English and Maths for a T Level.

You can also get an apprenticeship or some salons will take on juniors which means you can learn while working.

As a junior hairdresser, you'll be expected to make appointments, keep the salon clean and tidy, make drinks for the customers, shampoo and condition hair, cut simple styles under direction and make sure the towels and hair products are well stocked.

As a more senior stylist you'll cut and style hair, talk to clients and suggest style and colour ideas, give advice on minor hair and scalp problems as well as keeping up to date with new trends, techniques and hair products.

Once qualified you may be able to work freelance and rent space in a salon. With experience and interest in business you could move up to manage or own your own salon. If this is your aim, it may help to gain some business qualifications alongside hairdressing experience.
